LEARN DIGITAL STORYTELLING IN SUMMER MEDIA INTENSIVE

BERKELEY SPRINGS, WV—Summer camp is not just about crafts and hiking anymore. This summer, 21st century participants learn skills to make an original short film in Morgan Arts Council’s week-long Digital Storytelling media intensive. The program runs July 20-24 at the Ice House, and is open to ages 12 and up, including adults.

Instructors Margi Griffiths and Brice Williams teach all aspects of digital storytelling, from script writing to storyboarding, shooting and editing. Select films will be presented at the Morgan County Fair and over a new, upcoming website in a partnership with Comcast Project Open Voice.

“This camp is a perfect fit with the direction Morgan Arts Council is taking to make digital technology skills available in the community,” said Jack Kelly, director of the Digital Media Center for Community Engagement. “In the last few months, we have been teaching classes in video production and editing, and we are thrilled to offer this summer media intensive so more residents can learn how to express their vision in film.”

The intensive meets Monday through Friday, 9 a.m.-4 p.m. Scholarships are available.
