### STRING QUARTET TO PERFORM CHAMBER MUSIC AT THE ICE HOUSE IN BERKELEY SPRINGS

BERKELEY SPRINGS, WV – Music will again fill the air at the Ice House on Sunday, November 19<sup>th</sup> at 2 p.m. as the Morgan Arts Council (MAC) presents a concert featuring four performers from the esteemed Peabody Institute in Baltimore. Violinists William Weijia Wang and Angela Che are joined by Xingqiao Ren on cello and William Satterfield on viola to form the Apollo Quartet and collaborate in a program of chamber music featuring the works of Shostakovich, Brahms, and Haydn.

Formed in 2017, the quartet recently attended the Castleman Quartet Program in New York. All four artists have studied music extensively during their lives. Xingqiao Ren began his cello studies at age nine in Beijing and won second place and the Chinese Award at an international cello competition in Beijing. Violinist William Weijia Wang, also from China has performed with the Philadelphia Youth Orchestra and has held the concertmaster position in the Philadelphia All-City Orchestra for all four years of high school. Violinist Angela Che has served as the Principal Second and Concertmaster of the Los Angeles County High School Orchestra, as well as co-concertmaster then concertmaster of Olympia Youth Orchestra. William Satterfield began playing violin at age 6 and has since served as concertmaster and principal violist for multiple orchestras across the United States, including the Peabody Concert Orchestra.

Admission for this program is \$10 and \$8 for MAC members. Tickets are available at the door.
